# Notice of Race

#### 1. Rules

- 1.1 The race will be governed by the ISAF RRS(Racing Rules of Sailing) 2009 2012, ORC(Offshore Racing Congress) International/ORC Club Regulation, ISAF OSR(Offshore Special Regulations) 2012-2013, NOR(Notice of Race), and SI(Sailing Instruction).
- 1.2 If there is a conflict between NOR and SI, SI will take precedence. (Change of RRS 63.7)
- 1.3 All race boats that participate in the race shall meet the requirements of OSR category 3.

#### 2. Advertising

- 2.1 Boats may be required to display advertisement chosen and supplied by the organizing authority.
- 2.2 Boats may be requested to install camera for broadcasting and to embark a cameraman to assist broadcasting in the boat by the organizing authority.

## 3. Eligibility and Entry

- 3.1 Event: The race event is ORC(Offshore Racing Congress) CLUB
- 3.2 Eligibility(Keel Boat):
  - a) Mono hull keel boat over 9m(29.5ft) hull length, for ORC event the boat which can submit the certificate of 2012 relevant to the rating.
  - b) Special requirements for international sailing:
  - Competitors shall provide the documents such as Certificate of Registry, Inspection

certificate and any other copies of documents which are related to national law and regulation. (Korea, China and if any)

- Competitors shall facilitate the equipments which are required by the related law and regulation such as DSC VHF radio, liferaft and etc, if any.
- Details shall be advised from the organizer. (Advisor Jun Ik Sung, phone: 82-10-6402-1193)
- 3.3 Korean competitors(skipper and crew) must be registered as competitors of KSAF(Korea Sailing Federation).
  - \* Korean competitors who only have a membership of KSAF need to change as a registered competitor of KSAF(for providing a basis of insurance).

#### 3.4 Entry request

- a) Participants must issue the ORC rating certificate(www.orc.org), and complete and submit the entry form to the organizing authority(<u>icsailing@naver.com</u>). Any additional inquiry or assistance may be provided by contacting the committee (<u>icsailing@naver.com</u>).
- b) The entry request form[see attachment 1], and C.I.Q[attachment 3] must be completed and submitted to the committee until July, 12th(Thur.), 2012 (email icsailing@naver.com)
- c) The organizing authority will pay for 50% of the C.I.Q race entry expenses.
- d )Additional entry request or alteration of the submitted entry request will be until July, 18th(Wed.), 2012 and when additional request of boat or competitor is submitted, additional fee, which is 1.5 times more of the normal fee, needs to be paid to the committee.
- e) The following documents must be submitted with the entry request form.
- Safety Check List [see attachment 2]
- C.I.Q registration forms [see attachment 3]
- The 2012 relevant rating certificate
- Copies of ship's nationality certificate, ship's international tonnage certificate, ship's sanitation control (exemption) certificate, safety inspection certificate (Korean nationality ships only), and other relevant documents
- f) All boats participating for the race must be registered to the organizer office until August, 10th(Fri.), 2012.
- g) In the case of inevitable cancelation of the race entry, the cancelation must be notified to the organizing authority to prevent further problems to CIQ.
- 3.5 a) At least four crew members, but no more than twelve people, including the skipper, must be onboard before and after the race.
  - b) Changing crew members will be allowed after finishing each race. (except skippers)

**\*\*** When sending money, the name of entry boat owner or team leader must be addressed.

#### 6. Measurement and Safety Check

The official ORC measurer will proceed the measurement and safety checks.

## 7. Sailing Instruction

The sailing instruction will be distributed from 9th August 2012 in the organizer office. (Posted on the notice board of the Yellow Sea International Yacht Race Internet Home page)

#### 8. Racing Area and Courses

See attachment 4 for race course maps, routes, and information.

## 9. Penalty System

- 9.1 RRS 44.1 and 44.2 will be applied.
- 9.2 International decision will be composed in accordance with appendix N of RRS, and according to Rule 70.5, decision of jury committee will be the final decision.

### 10. Scoring

- 10.1 The Bonus Point System of Appendix A3 in ISAF RRS will apply.
- 10.2 The rating of keel boat will be based on the scoring system of ORC. Decisions will be made by the official race measurer and the race committee.
- 10.3 a) At least one race from the ORC's first or second leg is required to be completed to constitute a series.
  - b) There will be only one flight (race) in each inshore races in Weihei and Incheon Bay.

## 11. Support Boat

The official support boats shall be marked with raising the flag which is designated by the organizing authority.

## 12. Berthing

The racing boats and race support boats shall be kept in a assigned berth designated

by the organizing authority.

#### 13. Houl-out Restrictions

Keel boats are not allowed to be hauled out during the race except when they have the written permission from the race committee.

### 14. Radio Communication

During the race, the radio communication equipment(marine VHF) shall be fixed in operation at a designated frequency by the race committee and a GPS equipment shall be prepared to be operated at any time.

## 16. Sailing Subsidy

After the race, sailing subsidy will be provided depending on the sailing distance (ref. 17. the table of sailing subsidy amount) from the homeport of each race boats to the race starting place (Incheon port). For the race boats that finishes only the first leg (Incheon-Weihai), 30 % of the decided sailing subsidy will be provided, but if the organizing authority decides that the failure to finish the other leg races is inevitable, more portion or even the whole sailing subsidy may be provided.

• The subsidy for the places or countries that are exempt from the table(e.g. Honkong, Singapore, USA, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, United Kingdom, France) will be announced when required.

## 18. Safety

Competitors are fully responsible for their own and boat's safety and safety control. All participating race boats must comply with OSR category 3.

## 19. Disclaimer of Liability

Competitors are wholly responsible for the decision of departing from the port and

participating in the race. Competitors participate in the race entirely at their own risk (see rule 4, Decision to Race in the RRS.) The organizing authority, sponsors, supporters and cooperators, or any agents, company, or personnel that involve or is involved in this race, will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the race.

#### 20. Insurance

Each participating boat must be insured with a valid third-party liability insurance. The organizing authority may request to submit the proof of insurance and coverage or after filing entry request form.

Korean competitors must be insured with a valid insurance which covers personnel injury such as the marine leasure insurance or traveller's insurance. They must insure the designated insurance by KSAF when they register to KSAF.

#### 21. Visa Information

For participants visiting Korea two times during the race event, double or multiple entry visa shall be required. For participants visiting China during the race event, a L30 visa (single entry visa) shall be required.

6	Are the lifelines fully fixed and provided so that the crew is freely movable with clipping on them, and made with stainless wire( minimum diameter over 4mm for the boat LOA 8.5m ~ 13m), and in case that the wires have sheet or sleeve, inspected periodically?							
5	Are the Jack stays attached to trough-hull bolts or welded metal deck plates or other suitable and strong anchorage fitted on deck, port and starboard of the boat's centre line?							
4	Is radar reflector equipped on the boat?							
3	Are navigation lights, head light(s), and stern light(s) lighted properly?							
2	Navigation lights shall not be mounted below deck level. Are the reserve navigation lights and spare bulbs for navigation lights carried in the boat?							
1	Has the owner or person in charge have read and understood the basic regulation and definitions of OSR chapter 1 as follows? "The safety of the boat and crew is the sole and inescapable responsibility of the person in charge must do his best to ensure that the boat is fully found, throughly seaworthy, and maintained properly. He shall check and ensure that the soundness of the hull, spar, rigging, sails and all gears, etc. He must ensure that all safety equipment is properly maintained and stowed and that the crew know where it is kept and how it is to be used."
